



Washington, D.C. El Sr. y la Sra. Hirshhorn desarrollaron una amistad estrecha con importantes figuras de la historia del arte moderno. Fueron amigos cercanos de Picasso y de su esposa Jacqueline, a quienes visitaron en Francia muchas veces, compartieron con Willem de Kooning en su taller frecuentemente, y visitaron a Georgia O'Keeffe en Nuevo México. La Sra. Hirshhorn compró obras directamente a los artistas y recibió muchas como obsequio, afirmando así la gran amistad entre ellos. Piezas de Picasso dedicadas a ella "Pour Olga, Son Ami Picasso" (Para Olga de su amigo Picasso) y dibujos de Willem de Kooning inscritos "To Olga, Love Bill" evidencian la conexión personal entre artista y coleccionista.

Por más de 20 años la Sra. Hirshorn fue partidaria de las artes en el suroeste de Florida y se distinguió como generosa contribuyente a The Baker Museum. *La Colección Olga Hirshhorn* demuestra la continua expansión de la colección permanente del museo con obras significativas, diversas y del más alto calibre.

Una selección de importantes piezas del Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden de Washington, D.C. complementa las obras expuestas.





This exhibition is an acknowledgment of Olga Hirshhorn's legacy and a celebration of the collection she has left to The Baker Museum for this community to enjoy. Through a representative selection, the exhibition examines recurring themes in Hirshhorn's collection, including the friendships she and her husband, Joseph, maintained with prominent artists as well as her eclectic collecting practice.

Consisting of more than 400 works created by some of the foremost modern European and American artists such as Pablo Picasso, Willem de Kooning, Georgia O'Keeffe, Alexander Calder, Larry Rivers and Josef Albers, among others, *The Olga Hirshhorn Collection* reflects her diverse interests and tastes as a collector. Throughout the exhibition, pre-Columbian, African and Asian objects attest to Mrs. Hirshhorn's passion for travel and non-western arts and culture.

An active and passionate collector in her own right, Mrs. Hirshhorn was born in Connecticut to an immigrant Ukrainian family. She married her high school English teacher at age 18 and shortly thereafter was running her own employment agency. Her life changed in 1961 when Joseph Hirshhorn, a Latvian entrepreneur and art collector, called her agency looking to hire a chauffeur. After many phone conversations, Mr. Hirshhorn invited her to visit his newly purchased mansion in Greenwich, Connecticut. They became friends and later married.

Over the years, Mr. Hirshhorn acquired a large number of works of art, which in 1974 became the founding collection of the Smithsonian Institution's the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C. Together, Mr. and Mrs. Hirshhorn established close friendships with towering figures in the history of modern art. They were close friends with Picasso and his wife Jacqueline, whom they visited in France, spent time with Willem de Kooning in his

studio and often visited Georgia O'Keeffe in New Mexico. Mrs. Hirshhorn typically bought or received as gifts works of art directly from these and other important artists. She developed close, personal relationships with them, which she maintained through correspondences, frequent visits and the acquisition of works of art. Works by Picasso signed "Pour Olga, Son Ami Picasso" (For Olga from her friend Picasso) and de Kooning's drawings inscribed "To Olga, Love Bill" show the intimate connection between artist and collector, one that fostered the acquisition of multiple works for Mrs. Hirshhorn's collection.

For more than 20 years Mrs. Hirshhorn was a supporter of the arts in Southwest Florida and a generous contributor to The Baker Museum. *The Olga Hirshhorn Collection* attests to the museum's continual expansion of its permanent collection with significant works of high caliber and diversity.

Significant pieces on loan from the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C. complement the works on view.


## La Colección de Olga Hirshhorn

Esta exposición reconoce y celebra el legado de Olga Hirshhorn y de la colección que ha donado a The Baker Museum para el disfrute de la comunidad. A través de una muestra, la exposición examina temas recurrentes en la colección Hirshhorn, como la estrecha amistad que ella y su esposo, Joseph, mantuvieron con prominentes artistas y su ecléctica práctica de colecciónismo.

Con más de 400 obras creadas por algunos de los más importantes artistas modernos europeos y americanos como Pablo Picasso, Willem de Kooning, Georgia O'Keeffe, Alexander Calder, Larry Rivers y Josef Albers, entre otros, *La Colección Olga Hirshhorn* refleja sus diversos intereses y gustos como coleccionista. Piezas precolombinas, africanas, y asiáticas evidencian la pasión de la Sra. Hirshhorn por el viaje y por el arte y la cultura no-occidentales.

Una coleccionista activa y apasionada, la Sra. Hirshhorn nació en Connecticut de una familia inmigrante de Ucrania. A los 18 años se casó con su maestro de inglés de escuela superior y poco tiempo después dirigía su propia agencia de servicios. Su vida cambió en el 1961 cuando Joseph Hirshhorn, un empresario de origen letón y coleccionista de arte, llamó a su agencia solicitando los servicios de un conductor. Después de muchas conversaciones telefónicas, el Sr. Hirshhorn invitó a Olga a su nueva mansión en Greenwich, Connecticut. Eventualmente se hicieron buenos amigos y luego se casaron.

A través de los años, el Sr. Hirshhorn adquirió una gran cantidad de obras de arte la cual se convirtió en la colección fundacional del Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden del Smithsonian Institution en
